And they stay longer. Did you know that we outlasted national relief organizations in the Gulf Coast, following Hurricane Katrina? As others pulled out, we remained committed to helping.

Others know that we're good. During Superstorm Sandy, the American Red Cross granted \$1.5 million dollars to PDA to support our local efforts because of our reputation for good stewardship and our sustainable approach.

As PDA rushes toward the chaos of disasters, it depends on thousands of volunteers. The ways to serve are almost as numerous as the types of disasters we face. Some are simple and require only a short time commitment; others require specialized training and a willingness to drop everything on a moment's notice.

I'm pleased to let you know that James Kirk, PDA's Associate for Disaster Response (U.S.), will join us on May 22, for a pre-Gathering workshop, focused on how you or your congregation might support the denomination's disaster relief ministries. In 2017, because of your generous support, PDA was able to grant more than \$4 million across the globe; support 7,136 work team volunteers who helped those affected by disaster; deploy 418 National Response Team members who spent 2,122 days in the field in 70 presbyteries; train 110 Presbyterian Women in disaster preparedness; screen films in 6 festivals; and through Church World Service, aided in the collection and distribution of 243,942 Gift of the Heart kits and blankets.
